DIRECTOR

Peter Segrove has been associated with Company Theatre for seven years and has both acted and directed for us on a number of occasions. He also directs for North Shore Operatic Society - his specialty, and greatest love, Gilbert and Sullivan. So far he has YEOMEN OF THE GUARD, THE MIKADO and RUDDIGORE to his directing credit. He is also the current President of Company Theatre.



CRAIG DONNELL This is Craig's first production for Company Theatre; straight from the role of Curly in OKLAHOMA for Music Theatre Productions, Bobtail in CINDERELLA (Nth Shore Operatic) and a cabaret with Marcus Craig (alias Diamond Lil). MAULDER Charley's Aunt seventh performance for 'Company' - he began as a lights man back in 1983. Acting is his first love but he has been known to flirt with song and dance in such productions as BEST LITTLE WHOREHOUSE IN TEXAS, (Auckland Operatic) and North Shore Operatic's CINDERELLA. In his most recent role for us he played the 'village idiot' in BONAVENTURE - prior to that. Jack in MOTHER GOOSE, another of guestionable intelligence. We'll leave you to decide whether the type-casting has continued in CHARLEY'S AUNT.

ROSALIND CLEWS Ros's original intention in joining 'Company Theatfe' was to assist back-stage. But in the five years since she has somehow managed to play a maid in GASLIGHT and a nun in BONAVENTURE, as well as become the real-life mother of twins. When pressed to say which was her favourite role she would say only that the twins took up less time!



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DAVID KEMP David appeared as a butler in "Unexpected Guest", our first production here in Belmont, so servitude is not new to him (he plays Jack's 'man' in CHARLEY'S AUNT). In between he has had several other roles for 'Company' to his credit; not the least of which were three MUSIC HALLS. In one of these he achieved notoriety as a giant fairy and in MOTHER GOOSE he was 'well done' in a multi-layered goose costume - the tender timer has still not been located! NIKKI RAYNER Nikki has appeared in a number of musicals, OKLAHOMA, OLIVER, DIVORCE ME DARLING, RUDDIGORE and as Annie in ANNIE GET YOUR GUN. Her most recent performance was as Miss Muffett in CINDERELLA; despite a definite aversion to spiders. When asked how she coped she said she "just had to tuffet out!". Company Theatre is pleased to welcome Nikki in her role as Amy in CHARLEY'S AUNT.



LEANNE WATKINS Leanne is at home both on the stage or in a back-stage role, but in three years with 'Company' she has appeared in DEAR DELINQUENT, MOTHER GOOSE and MR PIM PASSES BY. Leanne recently danced her way through CINDERELLA for Nth Shore Operatic, relying on a dazzling and constant smile to disguise two left feet.





MIKE BELSHAM CHARLEY'S AUNT is Mike's third appearance with Company Theatre he previously appeared in MOTHER GOOSE (no make-up required) and the murdering doctor in BONAVENTURE. Mike has appeared in a number of musicals and claims that after only five years in show business he knows the answer to the ultimate 2en question - 'what is the sound of one hand clapping?'.



DEMPSEY WOODS Dempsey was introduced to theatre and quickly became addicted to it whilst still in the 3rd Form. He played several. leading roles whilst still at school and this is his first 'speaking' role in amateur theatre. Having made an ass of himself as one half of a horse in CINDERELLA for Nth Shore Operatic, he is determined not to repeat the experience. Why did he ask us not to reveal which half? MIKE MAHER A long-time stalwart of Nth Shore Operatic, Mike has specialized in character roles in both Gilbert & Sullivan and more modern musicals. Following a happy association with a number of 'Company' people in CINDERELLA he needed little encouragement to join the cast for 'CHARLEY'S AUNT; his first non-singing role. Married with two children and three cats, Mike is fond of theatre, travel and socializing - not necessarily in that order.

After a hard day at the office there's nothing Birkdale's Mike Belsham likes better than to light the lights and step on stage.


Mr Belsham (40) is chief inspector of Auckland traffic department patrols, but after hours he might be an ugly sister or Mother Goose.
