Most of us at some stage have been faced with the prospect of losing our job, particularly in recent times. Some of you may have actually lost your job, or know someone who has; all too common phenomena these days.

Unemployment has a profound effect on one's life, one's family and friends and this play serves as a reminder that a job is so much more than a weekly wage or monthly salary. Although society is changing as a result of more or less endemic unemployment, it still attaches a great deal of status to being employed, to the work ethic and to success.

"Why Me?" takes a lighthearted look at some of these issues, as a civil engineer in his late forties struggles to come to terms with redundancy. His reaction is one of non-acceptance - why me? and what I find particularly interesting in this play is the effect his situation has on his family and friends.

All of us associated with the play have, I think, been affected by it in some way. I hope you too find rich food for thought behind the comedy, and are entertained by our interpretation.
