


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# **HABEAS CORPUS**

For many years I had dismissed Habeas Corpus - the title suggested a dry legal drama of no particular interest to me. It was therefore a delightful surprise a few months ago when I idly picked it off a library shelf and had a quick browse. One page in and I was hooked. It is a very funny play - almost I suppose a parody on farce, lust and the permissive society- and the style in which Alan Bennett chose to write it is very unusual. It is a style which enables a director and cast to add many ideas of their own without damaging the play unduly! Ideal for a group like us!

We had a lot of fun with <u>Habeas</u> throughout rehearsal. I have been blessed with a very strong cast and an extremely able assistant, Wendy Kristensen, whose help has been invaluable throughout the last few weeks.

We hope you enjoy our first production in THE ROSE.

#### THE DIRECTOR

Peter Segrove has been around Company Theatre for a long time now. He is one of the few current members who remembers Company before we moved to Belmont. 'Habeas Corpus' is the 6th show that Peter has directed for us, the others being two <u>Music Halls</u>, '<u>Mother Goose'</u>, '<u>Charley's Aunt'</u>, and '<u>Not Now</u> Darling'.



He has also appeared on stage for Company on numerous occasions - most recently as the harrassed *director* in '<u>Murder in</u> <u>Company'</u>.

Peter has also directed productions for North Shore Operatic Society, Perkal Productions and Auckland Light Opera. The fact that two of these societies no longer exist is an unfortunate coincidence!!



#### **THE CAST**



Max has been involved in Theatre since childhood, although in later years the involvement has been minor. He has acted in all types of productions from **Greek Tragedy** through **Shakespeare** to **Review** and has been backstage in props, lighting, stage management, and in theatre administration. This outing with Company is his first major role in a full length play since his young family forced him into his chrysalis.

Catherine was acting with Repertory Groups all over the North and South Islands until the child rearing years forced her into a sustained period of silence (for probably all of 15 minutes.) She first stretched herself across Company's stage during '<u>Murder In Company'</u> and is now fully extending herself as the 'enormous and out-standing' Muriel in '<u>Habeas'.</u>





Lyndall's previous acting roles include a blind woman in '<u>Wait Until Dark'</u> and a pregnant woman in '<u>Alfie'</u>. Now she is a flat-chested mousey spinster. As she is none of these things in real life, she longs to play a role more like herself. So if anyone needs a Katherine for '<u>Taming of the Shrew'</u>, give Lyndall a call.

James is a hairdresser by day and throws himself around theatre spaces of Auckland at other times. Migrated from Hamiliton after productions with **Electra**, he has performed this year in **Summer Shakespseare**, at the **Pumphouse** and the **Watershed**. Holds drama papers from Waikato Uni, Diploma of Drama from Auckland Uni. and this is his first production with Company, so please be nice to him as nobody else seems to like him.





Sherry 'swept' into Company Theatre in May '91, with a 'polished' performance in '<u>Middle Age Spread'</u>. She 'dusted' down a few items for '<u>Music Hall'91'</u> before finally coming 'clean' during '<u>Murder In Company'</u>. She has always wanted to act the part of a Cleaning Lady and '<u>Habeas'</u> gives her this chance.



Mike has performed over 25 principal roles with various theatre societies throughout Auckland. Most of these have been with North Shore Operatic where he specialised in character roles. He was last seen with Company in <u>'Charley's Aunt'</u>. Mike has 4 cats, a something-cross Rhodesian Ridgeback dog, a son-inlaw, two children and a wife. (Not necessarily in that order!)

Heidi has been involved in theatre since 1985, singing and dancing her way through many musicals, with groups such as **Gisborne Theatre Arts** and **Wellington Operatic**. After a short fling with the theatre in London, and many travels later, she has landed here in Company in this her first performance with them.





Penny has been involved with Company for several years, appearing in 'Fifty Fifty' and 'Death on the Nile', and active in theatre in Gisborne, Wellington, Spain and Britain. Having been playing domineering mothers since she was 20, she is now using this experience to bring up her own children. She will be appearing in 'Nicholas Nickelby' for the Lunchtime Theatre in Takapuna later this month.

At an early age John had to choose between the stage and the priesthood. Going by his **Canon Throbbing**, he should have chosen accountancy. Joined Company Theatre in 1989 for <u>'Who's Life is It Anyway?'</u> and hasn't looked back since. Not renowned for looking where he's going either.





Gordon joined Company for' <u>Music Hall '89'</u>. In 1990 he was a sizzling Dame Trot in '<u>Babes in the Wood'</u>, and in 1991 directed '<u>Middle Age Spread</u>.' Earlier this year he played Stone in Howick Little Theatre's production of '<u>The Business of</u> <u>Murder'</u> - a complete change of character he says.

Chris has been performing for years. In his spare time he has been a boy soprano and even the third cornet in a D Grade brass band. A very brief overseas experience led to his wide renown in stage, television and street theatre. In this production, however, Chris will be fully stretched (and well hung) in a largely non-speaking part, and this photo (right) may have to serve as a more lasting memorial.


The play is set in the living room of the Wicksteed house, and on Brighton Pier.

### JUNIOR COMPANY






