
Biographies

Synopsis of Scenes

The action of the play passes in the drawing room of Lord Arthur's house in Grosvenor Square, London.

The time is the 1890's.

Act 1 Evening

Act II

Scene 1 Early Evening, several days later Scene 2 The following morning

Interval

There will be ONE interval, after Act 11, Scene 1, during which refreshments will be served in the foyer.

Lord Arthur Savile's Crime is based on a short story by Oscar Wilde. It is set in the 1890's in London where the young Arthur finds, on the verge of his marriage, that a palm-reader predicts he will commit a serious crime some time in his life.

He decides, rather than bring shame and scandal to his marriage, he will commit the dastardly deed before he ties the knot, and his wife would then not have to "hang her head in shame", to quote him.

Unfortunately, deciding on just who should be the object of his endeavours and the method required to carry them out, are not straight forward matters.

Things go from bad to worse, but in the best tradition of theatrical comedy, everything works out well in the end.

This is the second production Peter Robertson Millar has done for Company Theatre. The first was a 17 minute one act play called A Cut in the Rates for our Three Play '95.

Peter has acted and directed for Welisford Drama Club and Warkworth Theatre Group for many years. He has enjoyed such plays as "Boeing Boeing", "Habeas Corpus"; "Outside Edge", "Blithe Spirit", "Key for Two" and numerous musicals.
