Last year's winner of the Katherine Mansfield Memorial Fellowship, Roger Hall needs no introduction to New Zealand audiences. From 'Glide Time' to 'Market Forces', 'Middle Age Spread' to 'Conjugal Rights', he has delighted New Zealand audiences for over 20 years.

I was delighted when Company Theatre asked me to direct their production of Social Climbers. Being an avid Roger Hall fan and having directed Glide Time in 1985 and Prisoners of Mother England in 1988, I am familiar with his parochial writing with its incisive wit. This is another gem from his pen and I've thoroughly enjoyed the journey Social Climbers has taken me on.

****** Biographies of The Cast (in order of appearance.) HELEN ANN DAVIES (Susan)

This is Helen's first foray into "straight" theatre. She has extensive musical comedy * experience from Nellie in South Pacific (North Shore Operatic Society) to Mary Kenny * in De Black Patent Leather Shoes Really Reflect Up? (Auckland Music Theatre Company.) Helen has played the Madam of a Brothel in Can-Can and says it is no reflection on her true character - of course! She enjoys going from one extreme to another.

* PENNY SKYRME (Kath)

*Penny first appeared for Company Theatre in another Roger Hall play, Fifty Fifty. Since then she has done many productions with Company-mainly as mothers! She * excelled as the dominating mother Lady Julia in Lord Arthur Savile's Crime and $\frac{1}{2}$ played a completely different mother as Sally in Mothers and Fathers. A further $\frac{1}{2}$ * motherly figure was Lady Rumpers in Habeas Corpus in 1993. But for this play she + has thrown away the padding, but not the mother character!

REBEKAH BERRESFORD (Annie)

This is Rebekah's first non-Shakespearean production. For the past 7 years she has * appeared in numerous plays by the great bard including as Nerissa in Merchant of Venice (Westpoint'97) and Phoebe in As You Like It (Milford Playhouse). She is really enjoying herself in this non-Shakespearean play where "You can't rely as much on the text for character." The part of a counsellor she sees as quite ironic, as she has grown up with counselling. Her own mother is a psychologist.

MOIRA COOTE (Emily)

Moira's involvement with Company Theatre spans many years. She has appeared on stage in Situation Comedy, Steel Magnolias and most recently in Palladium where * her skills as a choreographer were well and truly put to the test! She feels she is always cast as the sweet as pie, mumsy kind, and is determined to find a play where she can be completely different. In the meantime she also makes an excellent, kind teacher to the Junior Company children each Saturday afternoon.

ADRIENNE MORGAN (Maxine)

This is a double debut for Adrienne, a very experienced actress. It is her first time for Company and her first production in Auckland. A kiwi by birth, Adrienne has spent many years in Brisbane where she has been involved in stage and television. Her * theatrical credits include well known plays like House of Bornarda Alba by Garcia * Lorca, The Matchmaker by Thornton Wilder and What the Butler Saw by Joe Orton. T.V. credits include local shows and 2 years of voice overs for ABC T.V.

* JENNIE GREGORY (Sinead)

New Roger Hall hits Belmont

The latest work by New Zealand's most famous living playwright Roger Hall, hits the boards in Belmont from April 18.

Fresh from its highly successful professional production in Auckland last year, the Shore's Company Theatre scored the amateur performance rights for "Social Climbers" as soon as they became available, and will produce the community theatre premiere of the show at Belmont's Rose Centre Theatre.

The play features an all female cast who explore the highs and lows of life as only Hall can write about it. The women are on a tramping excursion which challenges each of them in different ways and provides a brilliant backdrop for the uniquely Kiwi humour which has become a "Hallmark" of the creator of Middle Age Spread and Market Forces (on television currently).

The show is directed by Steve Wright who says of the cast; "Each of these women is just fantastic in this show, I think our audiences will be coming back for more."
