MIKE BAKER has a 42 year history in commercial radio in New Zealand; in the 1970s he managed Radio Hauraki and Radio I. He opened the first private radio network in New Zealand in Alexandra and then returned to talkback in 1985. For the last 16 years he has been a host with Radio Pacific Network and most recently has set up the Devonport Flea, establishing community radio in Devonport. Jim Anderton will be formally opening the station in the next few weeks. Mike acted as a boy with the Thespians in Wellington and is delighted to be amongst local people who are 'up front': people who, like him, love to act and to present.

SIAN DAVIS: this is Sian's second appearance on stage for Company Theatre – Marjorie, the Mother-in-Law from Hell in *Just Between Ourselves* being the first. Hopefully this is a somewhat more endearing mother, coping in a world gone ever so slightly bonkers – and Hell is here!

STEVE WRIGHT: a dedicated thespian from way back, Steve has played a variety of roles, the most recent Pa Larkin in *Darling Buds of May* for Howick Theatre, Sam in *Sisters Rosensweig* for Dolphin Theatre and the Porter in Shakespeare's *Macbeth* for Titirangi Drama. Steve has directed over 15 plays including *Outside Edge* and *Social Climbers* for Company Theatre, *Via Satellite* and *Bert & Maisy* for Dolphin Theatre.

AARON WHITEHOUSE: Aaron (aged 17), one of the younger members of Company Theatre, made his theatrical debut when he was four. Many of you will remember Aaron from Junior Company Theatre productions. "It is a refreshing change to be in a drama as I usually perform in musicals, and I have enjoyed working with such experienced actors".

JOHN BURTON has been with Company Theatre for 5 years and has been busy both on stage and behind the scenes. Last year was a busy year for John with 3 plays *How the Other Half Loves, The Pain and the Passion* and *Outside Edge.* John is just beginning his second term as Club President.

RICHARD PARMEE: back on the boards. It's been too long but what a wonderful challenge it's been. I love (Company) Theatre and all the people involved with this show. Thanks Lynne.

BOB STEVENS has recently been playing in a trilogy of Ayckbourn comedies. He said he'd "like to play someone a bit evil for a change". He got his way.

SUSAN LANDEG: this is Susan's second only foray with the Rose Centre and Company Theatre. After a string of musicals she is finding it a pleasure to return to drama, with a talented cast, and finally the chance to work under the directorship of Lynne Davis.

NIGEL FLOCKHART: prior to working for the Caledonian Times, Nigel held posts as Alex in *Outside Edge*, Tesman in *Hedda Gabler* and Arthur in *Lord Arthur Saville's Crime*, all for Company Theatre. Previous experience also includes work with Pumphouse Winter Classics and Mairangi Players and originally Gisborne Theatre Arts as musical correspondent.

SAMUEL BUTLER gets a mention in *The Dark*. He lived from 1835 to 1902. Best known in New Zealand for *Erewhon*, he also wrote *Higgledy Piggledy - An Apology for the Devil.* "It must be remembered that we have only heard one side of the case. God has written all the books."

Darkness Falls was commissioned by the Palace Theatre in Watford, England and it received its first public performance on 29^{*} January 1999.

Jonathan Holloway adapted *The Monkey's Paw*, WW Jacobs' 1902 classic tale of suspense, into a one act play set just after WWII. *The Dark* is an original companion piece set in contemporary time.
