# 'ALLO 'ALLO

Sitting in cafes in St Germain des Pres in Paris last Christmas I started planning this production of 'Allo' Allo; I adore everything about French cafes from the smell of the Gaulois to the taste of warm French bread and croissants, to the feelings of warmth and bonhomie amongst the very vocal patrons, and of course the grouchiness of many cafe proprietors in these cafes many of which have probably changed little since the 1940's. I began to develop my vision of a bustling Cafe Rene, dominated by the well meaning Edith trying to control her tormented husband Rene amidst the demands of Germans, Italians, Resistance workers, sexy waitresses and British airmen, and to become excited by the prospect of bringing the wonderful stage version of the TV series to life. In the process we have become a very close-knit team of eighteen experienced actors and as many stage crew; the mutual support has been amazing and the rehearsals have been filled with laughter with the greeting 'Allo 'Allo resounding round the Rose Centrel I thank everyone who has worked so very hard to bring Cafe Rene to life.

There will be a 15 Minute interval between the two acts

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# DIRECTOR'S PROFILE

Back in the UK she directed plays and musicals for drama groups in the Royal Navy and for Putney Players in London. Kathy loves directing comedy, with the emphasis on timing and characterisation.

Karl Buckley - (Rene) Karl's last stage outing was performing as Gary in Company's production of "Noises Off". Now playing the iconic role of Rene made so famous by Gordon Kaye has been an enjoyable challenge, and he is glad his wife Claire encouraged him to help hide the portrait of the fallen Madonna with the big boobies! Karl is more often found in the director's chair, and also serves on the PumpHouse Trust committee and the Auckland Community Theatre Trust.

Julie Collis - (Edith) "People actually pay to come and see a diverse bunch get together and have such a lot of fun! From discussions about which sausage goes where to how many paintings there really are, it has been a laugh a minute. Julie's last appearance for Company Theatre was as the very elegant 'Hilda' in 'Daughters of Heaven' and she regularly appears in various TV dramas and commercials.

Emma Codd - (Yvette) Emma is delighted to have been given the opportunity to "play" in 'Allo 'Allo, and what fun she has had uncovering her latent sexy French "serving" girl persona! Previously Emma has been seen in "Top Girls", "1789", "Little Women", "Rent", "By Jeeves", and most recently "The Producers".

Anna Sheridan - (Mimi) Anna has been performing in the Rose Centre since she was five, and at present is completing her degree in English and Drama at Auckland University. Anna has been in numerous musicals, plays, TV series, feature films and adverts. Anna loves playing the character of Mimi and says it's a nice excuse to go blonde and be silly for a few weeks!

Graham Wagstaff - (Leclerc) It's great to see Graham back on stage at Company; he has appeared in most theatres in Auckland and recently a role in Shortland Street. He was a compere/manager in Buddy for North Shore Music Theatre, and a gondolier in The Gondoliers for Centrestage. Graham says that he finds Leclerc's memory loss catching and feels guite at home with the character!

Kate Orgias - (Michelle) Listen very carefully...Kate has been in as many roles in radio, as Michelle is in disguises. From being creator/producer for Radio NZ National's "Summer Noelle", radio news reporting, documentary, acting, directing radio drama, to being the weekday morning host on RDU in Christchurch. Now back in Auckland, back to her love for theatre. Kate is delighted she gets to play Michelle 'more than once'.

Richard Ellsworth - (The Piano Player) Richard spent his childhood as a member of the Rhyl Children's Theatre in North Wales later adding music to his list of misdemenours. After gaining zero for the French test at school his teacher wrote "Improving" so he's relieved to have a non-speaking role as the French piano playing peasant!

Steve Wright - (Colonel Von Strohm) Steve has over twenty years experience in community and professional theatre and was last on stage at Company Theatre as Mr Rieper and Mr. Geeson in "Daughters of Heaven". While in Oxford he played Stephano in "The Tempest" at Trinity College Gardens and was Nim in "The Merry Wives of Windsor" at Merton College Fellows Garden. Steve has directed "Someone Who'll Watch Over Me""The Memory of Water", "Social Climbers""Outside Edge" and ""Curtain up on Murder" for Company Theatre, and is delighted to be involved in such a fun production as 'Allo''Allo

Scott Hayden - (Captain Bertorelli) "Funny Money" marked Scott's Company Theatre debut he now makes a welcome return to the Rose Centre venue where he previously performed as Colonel Jessup in Mairangi Players' "A Few Good Men". Scott's stage experience ranges from the serious "And Then There Were None" and""The Talented Mr Ripley" to the comedic with "Ghost Writer" and "The Darling Buds of May", and he is delighted to have had the opportunity to work with the talented cast and crew on this production."

John Clarke - (Gen. Von Schmelling) 'Allo" Allo will be the 9th play that John has appeared in for Company Theatre. "I've played everything from drunks to taxi drivers, to policemen, to the Frankenstein monster's double, to sex maniacs. It's a great life at Company Theatre". John also appears occasionally in various television dramas and films, and can be seen in television and internet commercials.

Richard Parmée - (Herr Flick) Richard has been involved with Company Theatre for 13 years including two years as President and three as Vice-President. This is his 23rd time on stage and he is enjoying it as much as he has all the previous 22. Thank you Kathy for the opportunity and to the rest of the fabulous cast & crew for their patience!

Janine Hugo - (Helga) 'Allo' 'Allo is Janine's 3rd show in NZ and she is excited about her first performance for Company Theatre. Helga is a funny, sweet and very passionate character. Janine studied acting at the University of Stellenbosch, Cape Town, South Africa, and was part of a fantastic team who wrote their own musical and performed it during one of South Africa's biggest arts festivals. Janine specializes in physical theatre and wrote her own One-Woman-Show in 2005.

Nick Shallish - (Gruber) Nick hails originally from Hastings and returns to the stage after a 7-year break in foreign-speaking countries where no one appreciated his accent. He was an active performer on stage in Adelaide during 1998-2001 and was primarily involved in comedy and farce. An exception was his most recent role as Napoleon in War and Peace at the State Theatre, South Australia.

Richard Johnson - (Crabtree) Richard has been treading the boards since the age of twelve in a variety of roles in musicals, plays and dance productions. Since moving to New Zealand from the UK in 1996 he has been involved in a number of productions with Company Theatre including "See how they Run" and "Ghost Train". Richard appeared as Tom in Alan Ayckbourn's trilogy "The Norman Conquests" for Torbay Theatre.

# **PARKING**

From Weds 6th, there is to be **NO** PARKING in the Rose Centre Car Park.

Please park in Harrison Ave (or close to!. I know there are lots of us) and enter via the BACK DOOR, that I will leave ajar. At the end of the night, MEN, please walk the LADIES to their car, or at least ASK them if they will be O.K. It is quite dark in Harrison Ave. And also PLEASE respect the neighbours when you leave and keep your voices down as you exit the premises.

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# STARTING THE SHOW

I will give you a 10 minute CALL at 7.50pm. I will give you a 2 minute call, when I have heard that the audience is almost in. (Sometimes it may take until just after 8pm to get a FULL HOUSE seated!! xx) I will then ask for BEGINNERS on stage.

### DRESSING ROOM—the QUIET AREA.

Because of the large numbers in the cast, - from when you arrive, until the 10 minute call, you are free to move around the backstage area as there are many people to get dressed and made up. However, at the 10 minute call, I will close the door to the kitchen—and the Dressing Room area will become an absolutely **quiet, preparation area.** Anyone who needs to continue a conversation is asked to please go out to the back room. AT ALL TIMES <u>during the show</u> the dressing room area is **quiet.** Whispering is allowed, if necessary!

### REFRESHMENTS

I will liaise with FOH and ensure you have coffee, tea, biscuits. Please help to keep the kitchen tidy by popping your used cup into the dishwasher after use. (Or rinsing it for RE-USE please.) I will also have some mints and jellybeans on hand, for "freshness and energy"!! Xx

## RESPECT for each other

If you have any issue with something happening on the stage, or any issue with another actor, or member of the crew, **please speak to me** IN PRIVATE. Please try to refrain from any negative thoughts or comments if something does not exactly go as you anticipated. Everyone will be trying their best at all times. Any issues at all, I am there for you all! Remember to welcome Kiran and Richard when they come out for their cup of tea at interval. It is sometimes lonely in the Lighting Box and they are both new to theatre.

# Saying Allo to a new role

Listen very carefully . . . Julie Collis talks to *Sharu Delilkan* about playing the lead role in a theatre production of an infamous French farce that was popular on our television screens for so long

laying Edith in 'Allo 'Allo is a big buzz for Julie Collis.
"I love comedy and the challenge of getting the timing right," says the Birkenhead resi-

dent. "And I love Edith's unshakeable confidence and self-belief."

The Company Theatre's production of the hit BBC comedy 'Allo 'Allo is set in a small cafe in occupied France.

Edith's husband, the harassed proprietor Rene, is fighting his own war.

With the German Army in residence at the bar, Rene is risking his neck by working for the Resistance. He is also involved in hiding a priceless painting in a garlic sausage, which even now is being sniffed out by the Gestapo.

But, ultimately, his real problem is Edith, and what she'll do when she discovers his affairs with two sexy waitresses.

Despite wanting to give her personal take on Edith, Collis admits she's watched a few episodes of the TV classic "because it's a farce and to have a look at a number of technical things".

"I've certainly picked her brains but would like to think I've made it my own."

Collis, who chose art over drama when she was at



college, says she resisted the urge to get back on the scene until she had young children at home about 20 years ago.

"I was stuck at home and saw an ad for extras for

a film, *Shrimp on the Barbie*, starring American comedian and actor Cheech Marin. "After being part of the dance scene for the movie, I knew I'd caught the bug.

"It was not long after that I got an agent and decided to go to screen-acting classes."

The glass artist has since trained with noted acting coaches Maggie Eyre, Vicky Yiannoutsos and Raymond Hawthorne.

Her more recent roles include Hilda in *The Daughters of Heaven* at the Rose Centre and Grandma in *Grandma McGarvey* at The Pumphouse.

She also made her mark as the nosy shopkeeper in TV One drama, *Mercy Peak*.

Looking back, Collis admits it was a little daunting trying to return to acting after such a long break.

"It's much harder coming back in because there are the same people competing for a small number of roles.

"But I have no regrets. In fact I consider myself lucky to have two strings to my bow."
