CAST PROFILES

Guy Davis "Greg" - "If Guy were not upon a stage, someone else he'd rather be. If Guy were not upon a stage, slightly lost, he would be." Guy has been on stage and working behind the scenes for as long as he can remember. He has performed in Shakespeare and Pinter plays, musicals such as *Les Miserables* and *Fiddler on the Roof*, and several Ayckbourn plays to scratch the surface. *Relatively Speaking* is his first appearance for Company Theatre which has been thoroughly enjoyable for him. In his spare time, Guy enjoys long walks on the beach, warm wood fires on cold winter nights and a nice home cooked meal.

Nicky Gyles "Ginny" - After a ten year break from acting (mostly due to working unsociable hours), Nicky was extremely pleased to be back on the stage and to be a new member of Company Theatre. She started acting at the tender age of just 3 and has loved it ever since. She has performed regularly on stage, made a few television appearances and attended drama classes at The Dolphin and Maidment Theatres. Her last role was the lead in *Sylvia Plath* in 1999. Her big O.E. followed and interrupted her acting career so when she moved into the neighbourhood - just a short walk away from the Rose Centre - she was very excited to join Company Theatre and immediately got involved behind the scenes with the last production: *Boeing Boeing*.

Bob Stevens "Philip" - At heart, whether they know it or not, everyone who acts must surely dream of being able to walk on to a theatre stage, feel the warmth of the lights, draw a deep breath, and say "What ho!" Although he's acted in several Ayckbourn plays before, Bob says that *Relatively Speaking* will be the highlight - as long as he remembers to deliver that classic line.

Dianne Lamont "Sheila" - Recently Dianne has been working professionally with roles in the TVNZ series *Orange Roughies* and the NZ film *We're Here to Help*. This Ayckbourn play has tempted her back to the stage. "It's deftly written, the dialogue is delicious and the plot is both amusing – and confusing!" Dianne appeared here in Ayckbourn's black comedy *Just Between Ourselves* in 1996. This is her tenth appearance for Company Theatre.

ABOUT ALAN AYCKBOURN

Alan Ayckbourn was born in London in1939. He is one of Britain's most successful and prolific dramatists having written more than 60 works for the theatre including musical plays for children. Some of his better known works are *How the Other Half Loves* (1970); *Absurd Person Singular* (1973); and the trilogy *The Norman Conquests* (1974). BBC describes Ayckbourn as a keen commentator of the British middle class. A more recent play *House and Garden* was performed simultaneously in adjacent theatres with the same cast racing from stage to stage.

Sir Alan Ayckbourn (he was knighted in 1997 for his services to theatre), says of *Relatively Speaking*, "in general, the people who liked this play when it was first seen remarked that it was 'well constructed'; those that didn't called it old-fashioned. If the latter is true, then I suppose it's because, as the song goes, I am too. As to whether it's well constructed, well, in a way I hope it is, since I did set out consciously to write a 'well made' play. I think this is important for a playwright to do at least once in his life, since as in any science, he cannot begin to shatter theatrical convention or break golden rules until he is reasonably sure in himself what they are and how they were arrived at."
