
DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Why do I like this play? Firstly, it certainly doesn't lack in delivering a pretty fair dose of Roger Hall's characteristic humour and it makes me laugh, still, after the best part of two months' rehearsal. Four elderly gents, each with his own story to spending his declining years in the 'Victoria Rest Home', each thrust willy-nilly into the company of others with whom ordinarily he'd have nothing in common, hardly suggests the basis for a droll romp'— and it's not. The directorial challenge to finding the right balance between the humour and the tough reality, and poignancy, of the play is what has really engaged me.

A cast that it's been a delight to work with has made the experience especially satisfying.

CAST PROFILES

John Curry - "Edwin Davis"

I have researched the role of Edwin so thoroughly, I actually "had a bout of bowel cancer a while ago'. At the time I wondered if I would ever set foot on a stage again. So it's no cliché to say how thrilled I am to be back with the wonderful Company Theatre and with such a talented bunch both onstage and off. And to work with a director who really knows her theatrical onions is a huge bonus. Thanks, Sian (and thanks too to Mr Hall for such a meaty play).

Steve Wright - "Leo Maddox

Steve has long since been an admirer of Roger Hall plays. His first introduction was playing Hugh in "Glide Time" in 1981 and in 1986 he directed a production of "Glide Time". Following that Steve went on to direct "Prisoners of Mother England" in 1988, "Social Climbers" in 1998 for Company Theatre, "Market Forces" in 2003 and "Taking Off" for Howick Little Theatre in 2008. More recently he played Andreas the Albanian speaking refugee in "Tom Dick and Harry" by Ray and Michael Cooney, and Ernest in "Bedroom Farce" by Alan Ayckbourn.

Max Golding - "Alan Webster"

Max follows Alan's lead and has forgotten half of his long theatrical association which goes back over 6 decades. It's a long way since "Pixie and the Fairies" Max's first appearance with Company was in their Rose Centre opening production of Alan Bennett's "Habeus Corpus" in 1992 and he last appeared at the Rose Centre in the MSM production of Alan Bennett's "Talking Heads" monologues. He is also re-visiting the works of Roger Hall with Company, having played Reg in "Spreading Out" a few years ago. Max works with various Auckland theatre groups and this is the third time he has enjoyed working with Sian as director.

Nicholas Tarling - "Charles Benson"

Nicholas has played for a number of groups in Brisbane and in Auckland. His most recent outing was in "Someone Who'll Watch Over Me" for Company Theatre in 2008. In real life he is an Emeritus Professor of History but his specialty is Southeast Asia not Victorian Britain!

Shirley Eliott - "The Visitors"

For the last few years Shirley has spent more time writing, teaching, playing golf...than treading the boards. The challenge of getting inside the minds of these three forthright women was too good to miss.


Erica Kröger - "The Carers"
