

Novels get a life of their own in Improbable Fiction

Never would members of an innocuous writers' group consider themselves characters worthy of a hilarious comedy. On the North Shore we have the Mairangi Writers, the North Shore Writers Group and the Rose Centre Writers plus countless book groups who meet each month to discuss their favourite books over a glass of wine.

Playwright Alan Ayckbourn saw the opportunity to delve deeper into these bookish minds and see how the fictitious characters from their novels might come alive.

Company Theatre's final production of 2011 is Alan Ayckbourn's ingenious 'Improbable Fiction' in which six colourful personalities meet to share their efforts in amateur writing. They are all complex characters from the droll council worker Clem played by Rob Holland to the timid children's writer Grace played by Trudy Thumath. Into the mix enters the host Arnold's co-worker Ilsa who also looks after his elderly mother during the meetings. In the first act we see nothing untoward but after the interval, hilarious chaos ensues as the audience is drawn into an increasingly bizarre series of disconnected events.

New Company Theatre members Naomi Madelin and Jennifer Farr join a group of 'Company stalwarts' in this fun, fast-paced production.

Director Lynne Davis loves Alan Ayckbourn's plays and directed 'Relatively Speaking" for Company Theatre in 2009. Sets and props become ever more complicated - for Four Flat Whites in Italy, Company's last show, they built a car and a gondola. For this play there is an equally amazing contraption on stage, which has to be seen to be appreciated.

The season of 'Improbable Fiction' runs from Wednesday 16 November through to Saturday 26 November, with performances at 8pm from Wednesday - Saturday and a Matinee at 2pm on Sunday 20th November. Tickets are \$25 or \$20 for concessions and can be booked on 445 9900 or rosecentre@xtra.co.nz.
