

Events before the play

- Autumn 1943: Joe Keller allows his business partner Steve Deever to supply the USAAF with faulty cylinder heads resulting in 21 planes crashing. They are both arrested.
 - Nov. 25th 1943: Larry Keller disappears off the coast of China.
- July 1944: Joe Keller released from prison. Steve Deever remains there.

The Setting

The play is set in the backyard of the Keller home in 1947 (Ohio, USA)

The night Ann Deever returns to her old neighborhood to visit Chris Keller and his family, a tree in their backyard blows over in a storm. The tree was planted as a memorial to the older Keller son, Larry, a fighter pilot who was lost in World War II. This is the morning after the storm. Family members and neighbours gather in the yard to chat, to read the newspaper, and to discuss Ann's return.

Act 1 Early Sunday Morning

ONE interval of 15 minutes

Act 2 The same day, moving into twilight Act 3 The following morning. (Around 2.am)

The Director - Sian Davis



Sian's involvement with theatre, amateur and professional, long predates her history with Company Theatre. It starts in NZ in the 60s in the Taihape Town Hall, performing in some Whitehall farce she'd probably like to forget (fun at the time, but!).

A seminal period was her involvement with Theatre Corporate in 1974, which meant, eventually, actually getting paid to 'get up there and do it'. And eventually, that mutated into 'Hey, let's get others to get up there and, etc.... 's easier!' (out of respect to her fellow


directors, of course, that's not at all true).

COMPANY was the first theatre group, game enough to give her a 'shot' at directing with its production of **Hedda Gabler** 1998. Subsequently eight others have followed at The Rose including, oh, all sorts, but strictly conforming to her insistence on plays that are 'classic' or 'NZ'. The last was two years ago, **A Shortcut to Happiness** by Roger Hall (NZ comedy), and now she directs her tenth **All My Sons** (US classic).



DIRECTOR'S NOTES on the play

Arthur Miller's sharply edged critique of 'the American Dream' that lies at the heart of **All My Sons** (1947) was a significant factor in his being hailed before the House Un-American Activities Committee in the early 1950s.

Not overtly 'political', the play centres on an ordinary middle-class family in a city in the American mid-West. The family prospered very nicely out of manufacturing components for the US Airforce in WWII and, superficially, at least at the start, everything is pretty 'hunky-dory'..... but, how does a man live with the knowledge that 21 young pilots died directly as a result of his greed and deception? And with the thought that his partner and best-friend still 'carries the can'?

How much does the rest of the family, the neighbours, the partner's children, really know? And what happens as the truth is thrust upon them all?

Miller saw the play as an exploration of 'the geometry of relationships'. And that's the nub of it, that, and a concern with universal human values and the test of moral responsibility.

Meet The Cast



Reg Williams (JOE KELLER) is appearing with Company Theatre for the first time. His most recent appearances have included Frank - Educating Rita, Kipps - The Woman in Black and in the Centrestage productions of Noises Off, Out of Order, and Not Now Darling. Favourite parts include #7 -12 Angry Men, Archer - The Beaux Stratagem, George in Same Time Next Year, Danforth - The Crucible, and Guy - A Chorus Of Disapproval. Classic roles include Mercutto, Hotspur, Buckingham and Petruchio as a part of the Cliveden Festival. He toured in the Ubiquitous Theatre Company productions of Jeffery Bernard is Unwell and The Killing Game. In musical

theatre his roles include Byck - Assassins, Finch - How to Succeed..., Mongkut - King and I, Harold - Music Man, Billy - Carousel, Sykes - Olivierl, Doolittle - My Fair Lady, Zach - A Chorus Line, Nathan - Guys & Dolls and Laertes - Hamlet the Panto

ARTHUR MILLER - THE PLAYWRIGHT



Arthur Asher Miller (October 17, 1915 – February 10, 2005) was a prolific American playwright, essayist, and prominent figure in twentieth-century American theatre. Among his most popular plays are All My Sons (1947), Death of a Salesman (1949), The Crucible (1953) and A View from the Bridge (1955, revised 1956)



Lynn Webster (KATE KELLER) received her theatre training at Northwestern University in the US and the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts. Her professional career has taken her to Chicago, Toronto, London and New York; the highlight was being in Guys and Dolls at the National Theatre in London in the 80's. After moving to Auckland in 1997, she has played many leading roles in community theatre productions including One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest, 84 Charing Cross Road, The Importance of Being Earnest, and Dolly in Hello, Dolly! Lynn is delighted to join Company Theatre for the first time and she has appreciated the friendly welcome and support from all the cast and crew.





Richard De Luca (CHRIS KELLER) most recently seen in The Perfect Murder at Howick Little Theatre, Richard is delighted to be in his first show with Company Theatre. Previous shows at Dolphin Theatre include Rabbit Hole, It's Never Too Late and Memory of Water. Outside of acting, Richard is studying playwriting at the University of Auckland and is in the process of writing a full length sequel to Arthur Miller's Death of a Salesman. The chance to be involved in a production of one of Arthur Miller's other great plays was a dream come true.

Chloe (ANN KELLER) is a 29 year old intermediate school teacher with a passion for theatre. She studied theatre in high school and has taken on the role of director for her school production 'The Tempest.' Before teaching, she worked behind the scenes on a television current affairs show and took part in a weather presenting role. Chloe has always had a passion for performing arts and hopes to continue stage acting!





David Steadman (GEORGE DEEVER) was last seen on stage in Company Theatre's production of "When Dad Married Fury." David has acted in numerous productions across Auckland in plays written by Noel Coward, David Hare, Aaron Sorkin, Chekhov, Dale Wasserman, George Bernard Shaw and the Bard. One of his favourite playwrights being Arthur Miller – David states the power of Miller's work is his ability to hold a mirror up to the audience and the actors "reminding us of what we have chosen to forget." – Miller.

Josh Masterton (BERT) is a child actor with a passion for both theatre and television acting. Previously he has performed on stage with Performance.net and school productions, and has recently played a television role for Power Rangers on Nickelodeon. He has really enjoyed working with the other actors on All My Sons and loves playing Bert.

Her recent theatre credits include The Producers, Antonio in Shakespeare's The Tempest and as Hilda Hulme in Daughters of Heaven. She has worked as a Shakespeare presenter in schools with Emu Heights Theatre Company and enjoys being a Speech and Drama teacher. A Short History



Company began in 1980 in St Michael's Hall, Bayswater. The original 9 are remembered in our Logo.

By the late 1980's, COMPANY needed a permanent home and worked together with those wanting a Community Centre for the area.

In 1992 The Rose Centre was opened. Since then, Company has helped with the upkeep and upgrade of the Theatre and its facilities, working together with The Rose Centre Board. Other theatre groups use The Rose Centre, but Company Theatre is the resident society.

Company finally has its own rehearsal room – an upstairs extension to The Rose Centre, completed through fundraising and donations in 2014. Company Theatre would like to thank Paddy Stafford-Bush, (also the Patron of The Rose Centre); Geoff Clews and the Becroff Foundation, for their support of Company Theatre.
