




# COMPANY THEATRE



## IRA LEVIN'S DEATHTRAP

Seemingly comfortably ensconced in his charming Connecticut home, Sidney Bruhl, a successful writer of Broadway thrillers, is struggling to overcome a dry spell which has resulted in a string of failures and a shortage of funds. A possible break in his fortunes occurs when he receives a script from a student in the seminar he has been conducting at a nearby college -a thriller which Sidney recognizes immediately as a potential Broadway hit. Sidney's plan, which he devises with his wife's help, is to offer collaboration to the student, an idea which the younger man quickly accepts. Thereafter, suspense mounts steadily as the plot begins to twist and turn with devilish cleverness.

## **DIRECTOR'S NOTE**



#### Kate Birch

I'm a great believer in seizing opportunities when they arise, and pushing outside of my comfort zone. This can sometimes lead me into all sorts of trouble! However the opportunity to direct a play for the first time has been a fabulous experience. This is largely due to the amazing support I've received from the team at Company Theatre, but most of all the great cast who have now become an integral part of my family!

The journey of this November production has had nearly as many twists and turns as the play itself, but we've managed to survive rehearsals with only a few cuts and bruises!

I clearly remember when I first saw Deathtrap many years ago in the UK. It's the kind of play that really sticks in your mind. One of the things that sets this play apart from other thrillers is the clever mix of tension and humour. Deathtrap is Levin's best known play, holding the record for being the longest running thriller on Broadway and awarding Levin his second Edgar Allan Poe Award in 1980. It also was made into a film in 1982 starring Michael Caine and Christopher Reeve. I sincerely hope you enjoy our production as much as we have enjoyed making it for you. Hold onto your seats – it's going to be a bumpy ride!






