

SIAN DAVIS Director of Last Legs

Sian's involvement with theatre, amateur and professional, long predates her history with Company Theatre. It starts in NZ in the 60's in the Taihape Town Hall, performing in some Whitehall farce she'd probably like to forget (fun at the time, but!).

A seminal period was her involvement with Theatre Corporate in 1974, which meant,

eventually, actually getting paid to 'get up there and do it'. And eventually, that mutated into 'Hey, let's get others to get up there and... it's easier!' (No it's not!)

Company Theatre was the first theatre game enough to give her a 'shot' at directing with its production of Hedda Gabler in 1998. Subsequently nine other shows have followed at The Rose. Sian's preference has always been for plays that are 'classic' or 'New Zealand'. Last Legs is a Roger Hall New Zealand comedy that qualifies readily.




SUE GOLDING

Sue has a performer's Speech and Drama LTCL, ATCL, and has worked with most Auckland community theatres. Roger Hall roles include Judy in Four Flat Whites in Italy and both wives in Spreading Out, Isobel at Company Theatre and Elizabeth at Dolphin Theatre. She has been directed by Sian several times, favourites being Sister Aloysius in Doubt by John Patrick Shanley, Shirley in The Raft by Carl Nixon, and Margaret McAdam in David Williamson's Birthrights.



In September this year, she and husband Max enjoyed being part of Roger Hall's great initiative NZ Theatre Month, performing at The Vic Theatre in the new play **Blood or Water** by Devonport writer Margot McRae.




DIANNE LAMONT Edna

STEVE WRIGHT Angus

Steve is a big fan of Roger Hall's plays and has performed in and directed a number of them. He has performed in Glide Time (1978 Putaruru Theatre), Take A Chance On Me (2002 Company Theatre) and Who Wants To Be 100 (2010 Company Theatre). Plays that Steve has directed include Prisoners Of Mother England (1987 Torbay Theatre), Social Climbers (1997 Company Theatre), Market Forces (2002 Howick Theatre) and Taking Off (2008 Howick Theatre).



Steve spent some time in Oxford, England playing some notable Shakespearean roles such as Stephano in **The Tempest**, (2005 at Trinity College). While there he also directed **The Memory of Water** by Shelagh Stephenson at Keble College for the Oxford Theatre Guild.



LYNN WEBSTER Trish

Lynn is delighted to return to Company Theatre having appeared as the mother in Arthur Miller's All My Sons in 2016. Lynn received her theatre training at Northwestern University in the US and the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts. Her professional career has taken her to Chicago, Toronto, London and New York; the highlight was being in Guys and Dolls at the National Theatre in London in the 80's. After moving to Auckland in 1997, she has played many leading roles in



community theatre productions including **One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest, 84 Charing Cross Road, The Importance of Being Earnest**, and Dolly in **Hello, Dolly!** Last year's highlight was playing Sister Mary Lazarus, the rapping nun, in **Sister Act** at the ASB Waterfront Theatre.



ROGER HALL CNZM QSO Playwright of 'Last Legs'

Born 17 January 1939, Roger is one of New Zealand's most successful playwrights, arguably best known for comedies that carry a vein of social criticism and feelings of pathos.


A desire to write and to act was kindled by his father's talent as an impersonator, frequen

family visits to the theatre, especially revues, and by his love of post-war British radio comedies such as 'Hancock's Half Hour'.

As an only child growing up on the edge of London, he become an avid reader, and occasional actor. Hall began working at an insurance company, but in 1958, aged 19, he sailed for New Zealand on an assisted passage scheme for migrants.

In 2015 he was awarded the Prime Minister's Award for Literary Achievement in Fiction.






