ON DIRECTING LOCKDOWN IN LITTLE GRIMLEY

2020 has been a one play year for Company Theatre, producing Gary Henderson's Peninsula three times and suffering two lockdowns immediately before planned openings in March and August before finally staging the play to great acclaim in November.

Lockdown has been the theme. So what better play to choose for our 40th anniversary celebration than Lockdown in Little Grimley by the master of one act comedies, David Tristram. We have had a very short

rehearsal period during which we have found it difficult to contain the laughter and trust that the opportunity for our audiences to laugh unreservedly is a tonic at the end of a very difficult year in the theatre.

BIOGRAPHY

Kathy absolutely loves directing comedies, especially plays with strong characters and a touch of the ridiculous. Most recently she has directed Steel Magnolias (a little sad too), One Man Two Guvnors (definitely ridiculous), Ladies Day, Calendar Girls and two seasons of Fawlty Towers for Company Theatre: For Lockdown

in Little Grimley she has brought together four actors who have stood out in her plays for their skill in comedic timing and a stage manager who is skilled in controlling them.

Scott has been acting with Company Theatre since 2007, including two sell-out runs as Basil Fawlty in Fawlty Towers and More Fawlty Towers. Having played a variety of roles in North Shore Theatres ranging from the dramatic (Colonel Jessup in A Few Good Men with Centrestage) to the comedic (Captain Bertorelli in 'Allo 'Allo with Company) and mixtures of both (Elyot in Private Lives with Torbay), Scott has always appreciated the firm friendships forged during the course of each production - not the least of which being with his wife whom he met on the production of Funny Money.

Bringing Bernard to the stage is a wonderful opportunity to not only work alongside his cherished colleagues and dear friends once again, but to also celebrate the vital role theatre has been in Scott's own life.

James has been treading the boards since 2015. A late comer to the world of stage acting, James' first role was as Fred Baxter in Off The Hook. It was then on to Company Theatre's production of One Man Two Guvnors in the role of Francis.


